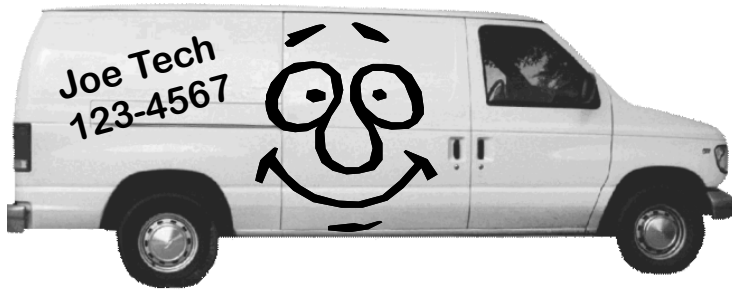


Would You Drive Different If Your Picture Was Plastered On The Side

Remember, most of your trips are fairly short and when driving in town, it's very hard to increase your average speed more than a few miles per hour. A few miles per hour is not going to make a big difference.
